About this paper



This paper is about changes we are making in South Australia.



The changes will help women and girls.



We want to make sure women and girls are:

• Living safely in their homes and in the community,



Having choices about being workers and leaders,



• Getting enough money to pay for things they need,



• Getting what they need to be healthy.

Why we need to make changes



South Australia is a good place to live.



But there are some things that are not good for women.

For example



2 in 5 women have been hurt by violence or sexual assault,



 there are less women leaders than men leaders,



 jobs that mainly women do pay less than other jobs,



 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women live with more sickness and injury than other people.



We want to make changes so that women and girls have better lives.

What the changes are



We have written down the changes we want to make.



We wrote them in a paper called "South Australia's Women's Equality Blueprint".

We put the changes into 4 groups.



We call these groups priority areas.

Priority areas are the changes that are the most important or the most urgent.

Safety and security

This is priority area 1.

This priority area will help us to

- Stop violence and sexual assault against women,
- Support women if someone is hurting them.

We will make 30 changes in this priority area.



For example, we are telling everyone about **coercive control.**

Coercive control is a type of family abuse.



It is very dangerous.



We want to stop coercive control.



We want to use a **law** to do this.

A law is a rule that everyone must follow.

Leadership and participation

This is priority area 2.

This priority area will help us to

- Support more women to be workers,
- Support more women to be leaders.

We will make 12 changes in this priority area.



For example, we will help women to join **government boards**.

A government board is a group of people who watch over an agency.



They are leaders.

They give the agency advice.

We want government boards to include women and men.



We want the numbers of women and men to be the same.



Some government boards might have more women than men.

Economic wellbeing

This is priority area 3.

This priority will help us to

 support women when they are learning and training,



 make sure women are getting enough money to pay for the things they need.

We will make 10 changes in this priority area.

For example, we will make a **Gender Pay Gap Taskforce**.

The Gender Pay Gap is about fair pay for women.

A Taskforce is a group of people who work together for a short time on an important project.





The Gender Pay Gap Taskforce will

- research how much women are paid in South Australia,
- tell us how we can help women to earn as much as men.

Health



This is priority area 4.

This priority area will help us to



• Give women what they need to be healthy,



• Give women choices about their health.

We will make 4 changes in this priority area.



For example, we will build a new hospital for women and children.

The new hospital will be bigger than the current Women's and Children's Hospital.



The hospital will help more women.



It will offer new services to help women stay healthy.

Next steps



We will work on all the changes so that women and girls have better lives.

A lot of people will work with us.

For example

- Other governments,
- Private businesses,
- Organisations,
- The community.



We will finish the changes by 2026.
